Create Impact

Week 1: Introduction to Leadership & Community Exploration

Week 2: Designing Change & Applying Leadership

Students engage in interactive discussions, field trips, and design thinking sessions to conceptualize a Community Summit or Social Action Project.

Week 3: Implementing & Celebrating Impact

Participants host their summit or project, followed by a reflection session and celebration with family and community leaders.
